Claim for Farm Household Allowance

It is a payment to support farmers facing financial hardship. It is able to be paid for up to 4 years in each specific 10 year period. To receive Farm Household Allowance, we will work with you to develop and implement a Financial Improvement Agreement aimed at improving your farm's viability and strengthening your long term financial circumstances. We will assign you a Farm Household Case Officer who will help you with this. In addition to the Farm Household Allowance payment, you may be able to receive vouchers for advice and training worth up to \$10,000. A Farm Household Case Officer can help you access these vouchers. If you need help to claim, you can call the Rural Financial Counselling Service on 1800 686 175. **Online account** Completing this form online is faster and easier. Access your Centrelink online account through myGov and select: Payments and claims then Claims then Make a claim. Definition of forced disposal of livestock

Forced disposal of livestock means disposal (including killing) of livestock, or all or part of a carcass of livestock by an entity for 1 or more of the following reasons:

- an action by or on the authority of, the Commonwealth, a State or a Territory that means the land or water cannot be used to support the livestock commercially (for example, compulsory acquisition of an estate in land or other interest or changing a law governing how land or water may be used), other than an action taken with the entity's free consent
- drought or natural disaster affected the availability of pasture, fodder or water so that the entity could not reasonably support the livestock
- reasonable concern for the welfare of the livestock
- a requirement by or under a law of the Commonwealth, a State or a Territory to dispose of the livestock.
