When to use this form



Use this form to claim Farm Household Allowance.

If you get Farm Household Allowance (FHA) you will get all the following:

- a fortnightly payment for up to 4 years in each specific 10 year period
- activity supplements up to a lifetime limit of \$10,000 to pay for activities to help improve your financial position
- a Farm Household Case Officer to work with you to help you improve your financial circumstances.

What else you will need to provide

You must complete and return an Income and assets (SA369) form.

Refer to the checklist provided at Question 62 to see what else you need to provide.

You, and your partner if submitting a joint claim, may need to provide identity documents. For a list of acceptable documents, go to **servicesaustralia.gov.au/identity**

Important note: You must return **all** supporting documents at the same time you lodge this claim form. If you do not return all documents, your claim may not be accepted. The only exception will be if you are waiting for medical evidence or other documents from a third party.

Farm Financial Assessment

If your claim is granted, you will need to complete a Farm Financial Assessment. We will send you more information about this after your claim is granted.

Partner permitted to enquire

Allowing your partner to enquire on your behalf may save you time when dealing with us. It will let you and your partner use more self-service functions online and over the phone.

If you give your partner **permission to enquire**, it will allow your partner to ask questions about your Centrelink payments and services. They could ask us:

- · your current rate of payment
- the reason your payment has stopped
- the reason your payment has gone up or down, for example, income and assets, debt and back payment information.

They **can** tell us how much employment income you were paid, changes in your circumstances and view your details online.

Thev cannot:

- act on your behalf with Centrelink
- · apply for payments for you
- · fill in and sign forms and statements on your behalf
- · come to appointments for you.

Changing your partner's permission to enquire is your choice and you can change this permission at any time.

Definition of a partner

Business partner

A business partner is a person or entity who you operate a business partnership with.

A partnership is 2 or more people or entities operating a business with the intention of making a profit.

Partner

We consider you to have a partner and be a member of a couple if you are either:

- married
- in a registered relationship. This is when your relationship is registered under a law of a state or territory.
- in a de facto relationship. This is when you and your partner are in a marriage like relationship but you are not married or in a registered relationship.

We may still consider you a member of a couple if you are not actually living with your partner. For example, your partner may fly-in fly-out or live away for work, like military or oil rig workers.

Definition of non-farm income

Non-farm income is any income not earned from the relevant farm enterprise. Examples of non-farm income could include (but are not limited to):

- non-farm employment
- interest payments
- rental income (including leasing land for agricultural purposes) unless it is part of a directly related business.

Example of assets


To receive Farm Household Allowance, you need to meet an assets test. Your combined personal and farm assets must be below \$5.5 million. Assets include:

- farmland
- farm machinery
- livestock
- crops
- houses (excluding principal residence)
- home contents
- cash
- business bank accounts (including farm management deposits)
- other financial accounts.

Definition of forced disposal of livestock

Forced disposal of livestock means disposal (including killing) of livestock, or all or part of a carcass of livestock by an entity for one or more of the following reasons:

- an action by or on the authority of, the Commonwealth, a State or a Territory that means the land or water cannot be used to support the livestock commercially (for example, compulsory acquisition of an estate in land or other interest or changing a law governing how land or water may be used), other than an action taken with the entity's free consent
- drought or natural disaster affected the availability of pasture, fodder or water so that the entity could not reasonably support the livestock
- · reasonable concern for the welfare of the livestock
- a requirement by or under a law of the Commonwealth, a State or a Territory to dispose of the livestock.
